SPECIALTY CAMPS

STEM: START YOUR ENGINES!

July 24-26 (\$100) - 13+ years old

This three day - two night program at HHCSR will give Scouts the opportunity to design a small model vehicle! During this camp they will have the opportunity to learn about circuits by building a model circuit, learn to use soldering equipment safely, as well as explore electricity by designing simple models and reading electricity meters.

Scouts will work on their Electronics Merit Badge, Electricity Merit Badge, and the NOVA Start Your Engines Award. A folder or notebook and a simple calculator is highly recommended for this course.

This program will explore how your life is affected by technology every day.



MARKSMANSHIP

July 27-29 (\$125) - 13+ years old

[For those who have earned rifle or shotgun merit badge.]

Spend three days and two nights improving your abilities with firearms. Understand safety with firearms, learn to sight a rifle, improve accuracy, and participate in competition shooting.



IOWA HIGH ADVENTURE EXPERIENCE 3 CAMPS IN 1 ADVENTURE!

July - 14+ years old

Looking to try something different for summer camp 2016? How about combining 3 camps into one adventure? Start at Ingawanis Adventure Base with COPE and Equestrian activities. Next bike approximately 60 miles to Camp C.S. Klaus and have fun with ice cave exploration, trout fishing, and mountain boarding. The next part of your trip takes you to the Maquoketa River north of Manchester for canoeing through the Whitewater Park at Manchester, to the Jones County Park Picture Rock for some rock climbing. From there you are brought to Howard H. Cherry Scout Reservation for high COPE activities and mountain biking. Details, exact dates and cost to be determined.

DIRECTIONS

From Iowa City/Cedar Rapids:

North on I-380 to exit 28, turn right (east) onto County Home Road (E34), go east to Hwy 13, continue east 5 miles into town of Whittier, turn left (north) onto Whittier Road (X-20), go 5 miles to town of Waubeek, turn right crossing bridge onto Boy Scouts Road, go 1 mile to Camp Waubeek, 2 miles to Camp Wakonda.

From Central City:

(Hwy 13) East 3 miles on E16, turn right (south) onto Duck Pond Road, go .7 miles, turn left onto Boy Scouts Road, go .7 miles to Camp Wakonda, 1.7 miles to Camp Waubeek.
