Cub camps registrations are on-line, starting April 15. Every unit received instruction either at Roundtable or in the mail. Have one person in each unit collect forms and register on-line.

- BSA Annual Health & Medical Form (completed within 12 months of camp)
 - ✓ Parts A & C - Parent/Guardian to complete, with all required signatures
 - ✓ Part B (physical) is recommended
 - ✓ Attach a photocopy of both sides of the family insurance card.
 - ✓ Keep the original form in home records. Send a legible copy with the camp registration.
- All medicines, except for those needed for immediate care, must be stored in Health Office
