NOTES:

1. Table 3-1 and this table together make up the duty responsibilities for youth.
2. The basic Indian style OA Regalia is defined in section 5.2.5 of this Lodge Membership Guide.
3. The sash will be either a Brotherhood or Vigil sash depending on membership level.
4. Counseling Brotherhood candidates consists of helping candidates with their Brotherhood requirements at chapter meetings and at least one conclave or Spring Fellowship.
5. All requirements for any given duty, except this one, must be completed within the twelve months prior to applying for that duty promotion.
6. If there is a strong conflict, contact, in order, the lodge advisor, the lodge chief, or the lodge professional advisor for a substitute responsibility.”
7. Requirement 13 for the Red Duty is waived for those members who achieve Red outside the Indian lore path.
