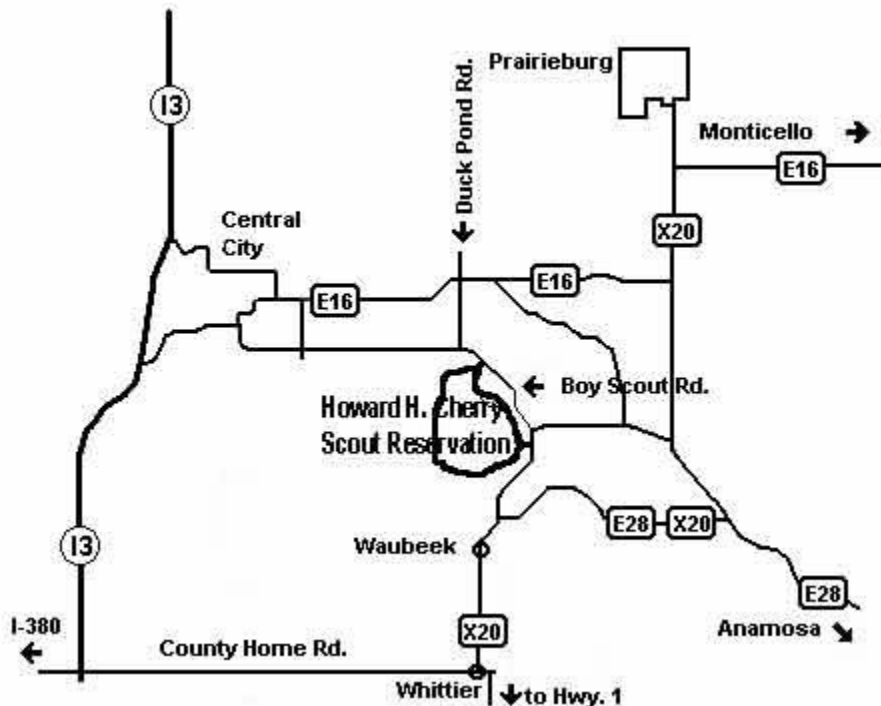

**From Iowa City/Cedar Rapids:** North on I-380 to exit 28, turn right (east) onto County Home Road (E34), go east to Hwy 13, continue east 5 miles into town of Whittier, turn left (north) onto Whittier Road (X-20), go 5 miles to town of Waubeek, turn right crossing bridge onto Boy Scouts Road, go 1 mile to Camp Waubeek, 2 miles to Camp Wakonda.

**OR**

North on I-380 to exit 16, turn right (east) onto IA 151/30, go east 6.8 miles to exit 259 turn right onto Hwy 151/13, continue north 11.5 miles to County Home Road (E34), turn right go 5 miles to town of Whittier, turn left (north) onto Whittier Road (X-20), go 5 miles to town of Waubeek, turn right crossing bridge onto Boy Scouts Road, go 1 mile to Camp Waubeek, 2 miles to Camp Wakonda.

**From Central City:** (Hwy 13) East 3 miles on E16, turn right (south) onto Duck Pond Road, go .7 miles, turn left onto Boy Scouts Road, go .7 miles to Camp Wakonda, 1.7 miles to Camp Waubeek.

**From Monticello:** Turn right (west) onto E16, go 12.4 miles, turn left (south) on X-20, go 1.2 miles, turn right onto E16, go 2.2 miles, turn left (south) on Duck Pond Road, go .7 miles, turn left onto Boy Scouts Road, go .7 miles to Camp Wakonda, 1.7 miles to Camp Waubeek.

## ***Merit Badges***

Start planning early for merit badge signups! This information will be entered by the Troop into the camp registration. All merit badge information should be submitted as soon as possible. If changes to schedules are necessary, they may be done on Sunday night at camp. **Scouts choices are entered by the Troop as soon as fees are paid.** If classes are full the Troop can adjust the Scouts' schedule then.

Key to the merit badge listings (available when all Scout fees are paid):

- These listings are merit badges ONLY.
- Difficulty rating: a ten-point scale (1 being easiest) to help determine which merit badges are appropriate for each Scout.
- Prerequisites MUST be earned before starting the merit badge.

Pre-Camp preparation: suggested requirements to be done prior to arriving at camp. They are either written requirements or not suitable to the camp setting. The merit badge counselors' focus will be on requirements that are most suited to the camp setting.

## Camp Fee

### Scout Fees

**All fees should be paid to the Hawkeye Area Council (HAC) by the unit, not by individual parents, unless the Scout is attending with the provisional Troop.** Please pay the designated Troop individual in charge of collecting and paying fees. All of a Scout's fees must be paid in full before access to merit badges registration.

**Fees Due: All fees are due no later than Tuesday, May 18, 2010.**

Camp fees provide central dining hall meals, limited campsite equipment, program equipment and areas, and top quality camp staff.

**HAC Scouts:** \$215 per Scout attending Howard H. Cherry Scout Reservation.

**Out of Council Scouts:** \$225 per Scout attending Howard H. Cherry Scout Reservation

**Provisional Campers:** \$215 per Scout for HAC Scouts.  
\$225 per Scout for out of council Scouts.

**Second Week of Camp:** All Scouts who attend a second week of camp will receive a discounted price of \$165 per Scout after the first week.

### Special Program Costs

The following programs carry an additional cost to help cover expenses associated with the program. This fee must be paid before registration in class is allowed. All fees are due by May 18, 2010.

### **A \$20 Late Fee is charged to anyone missing the above date.**

If fees are not paid by this date, the full fee plus late fee, total \$235, (\$245 out of council) must be paid by the beginning of your week at camp.

### **Scouts cannot sign up for merit badges until all fees are paid. Merit badge signup begins April 15; fees need to be paid by then to select a Scout's merit badges.**

## Spending Money

A well-stocked trading post is operated at camp. Items include handicraft materials, T-shirts, merit badge pamphlets, handbooks, ice cream, soft drinks, batteries, candy and camping equipment. The trading post and quartermaster are normally closed ½ hour before mealtimes.

Merit badge work in some of the program areas requires an additional expense to complete. Below is listed the approximate cost of supplies needed for the merit badge. Also listed is the cost of other items available.

## HEALTH AND MEDICAL RECORD FORMS

1. ***Any Camper arriving at camp without a properly completed Annual Health and Medical Record WILL BE SENT HOME!***
2. Annual Health and Medical Record Forms are available at the Council Service Center or on the web at [www.hawkeyebsa.org](http://www.hawkeyebsa.org).
3. We encourage you to retain the original forms and provide a clean photocopy to camp as they become part of the permanent camp record and ***will not be returned.***

## MEDICATIONS

1. ***ONLY MEDICATIONS IN ORIGINAL CONTAINERS WILL BE ADMINISTERED. Do not*** send weekly "pill boxes" or mix medications in bottles. We would greatly appreciate sending the ***original containers*** in a zip-lock bag with the Scout's Name and Troop Number written in permanent marker. Additionally, written information such as dosages, administration instructions, reason for the medication, and adverse effects would be helpful.
2. Medication will be administered as instructed on the bottle unless directed otherwise by a physician.
3. Please send only the amount of medication needed while at camp.
4. There is no need to send common over-the-counter medications (Tylenol, ibuprofen, cough syrup, Sudafed, Benadryl, etc.). Nearly all over-the-counter medications are available at Camp.
5. ***ALL*** medications (including over-the-counter medications) ***MUST*** be turned in to the Health Officer on arrival at camp. The medications will be secured in the Medical Center.  
***Exceptions –***
  1. Any medications which should be carried (i.e. inhalers, Epi-pens, nitro, etc.) should be on the person at all times.
  2. Adults may keep their medications ***LOCKED*** in a vehicle. No medications (including over-the-counter medications) are to be in the campsite.
6. It is the responsibility of each Scout to make sure they receive medications at the appropriate time. Verbal reminders will be given at mealtimes, but it is ultimately the Scout's responsibility.
