Many volunteers will be needed to make this once in a lifetime event successful. The Adventure Base 100 will be in operation from 12 Noon to 8:00 p.m. on Friday, June 18th and Saturday, June 19th. The "Base" will be located at Kirkwood Community College, 76th Avenue and Kirkwood Boulevard. More specifically, it will be located between Johnson Hall and the Facilities and Security building.

We will run two hour shifts (12 Noon to 2 p.m., 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 8 p.m.) at each of the theme/administrative areas.

- Anyone fourteen years of age and older on the date of the Adventure Base 100
- For BSA leadership, please wear your uniform – this is the time to showcase Scouting!
- Someone with a passion for Scouting that is able to communicate and share the vision, mission and ideals of the Boy Scouts of America

There are many different areas that need to be staffed. Look at the following list and qualifications below and see what you would be interested in doing to support this Centennial event. This call for volunteers will run from March 1, 2010 to May 31, 2010. After June 1, Hawkeye Area Council will begin placing volunteers into specific assignments. On Friday June 4 we will notify you of your assignment, scheduled time and place.

Adventure Base 100 / Positions available:

Entry Archway Greeters (need 10 per 2 hour shift!)

Description: Greet guests at the entryway and give a brief overview of the campus experience

Skills: able to work with youth and adults, need a lot of energy and personality!

Registration Greeters (need 6 per 2 hour shift!)

Description: Distribute registration cards to attendees for check-in

Skills: Seated job, not a lot of standing or walking, should be comfortable using a computer

Recruiter (need 6 per 2 hour shift!)

Description: Answer questions about Scouting including how youth and adults can get involved

Skills: Strong BSA program knowledge and the ability to steer interested people to their appropriate council contacts.

“Go Dome” Greeter (need 4 per 2 hour shift!)

Description: greet guests at projection dome, manage line flow and educate people about Scouting while they wait.

Skills: Can work with large amounts of people, personable and friendly!

Ropes Course Assistant (need 4 per 2 hour shift!)

Description: greet guests at Ropes Course, manage line flow and education people about Scouting while they wait.

Skills: Can work with large amounts of people, personable and friendly!

Museum Line Greeters (need 3 per 2 hour shift!)

Description: greets guests at Museum entrance, manages line flow while talking with attendees about Scouting.

Skills: need to have a great personality and able to work in a large crowd.

Museum Guides (need 3 per shift!)

Description: guides guests through museum and answer questions

Skills: Friendly and well-versed in Scouting’s past and future...special invitation to Scouting alumni!

Green Screen Technicians (need 2 per shift!)

Description: Facilitates the Green Screen interactive display

Skills: Technology savvy people needed, able to work with adults and youth

All around support (need 4 per two hour shift!)

Description: serve as a runner and a back up if needed

Skills: able to be flexible and have a good working knowledge of the campus

WOW! 44 people every two hours equals over 350 volunteers needed for this great event. Let's celebrate together the 100 years of Scouting's past and the promise of Scouting's future!
