



2010...Scouting's Centennial Year of Success...

- 104 young men from the Hawkeye Area Council earned the rank of Eagle Scout in 2010!
- The membership of the Council increased again this year with net growth in the overall traditional programs of Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting and Venturing, as well as our career Exploring program.
- 761 Boy Scouts attended our accredited, long term summer camp at Howard H. Cherry Scout Reservation.
- The 2010 youth retention rate was very high with over 75% of youth staying in Scouting from 2009, this is one of the best rates in the country.
- Fully funded and remodeled our front lobby area at the Council Service Center to allow for a new Volunteer Resource Center and staffed front counter to better serve our customers.
- Nearly \$200,000 was raised to purchase 21 acres of land adjacent to camp to make Camps Waubeek and Wakonda contiguous for the first time in its history. Closing will occur in 2011 and plans for development are underway.
- The Centennial James E. West campaign, kicked off in September 2009, resulted in 27 new James E. West Fellows who generously committed \$1,000 or more to the Endowment Fund!
- Both Cub Scout and Boy Scout advancement rates went up significantly in 2010 when compared to 2009.
- Cub Scout camping increased with plans in place to add even more campers in 2011. Camping opportunities include Day Camp, Bear Camp, Webelos Camp, and Cub Overnights!
- 105 Scouts attended the 2010 National Boy Scout Jamboree at Fort A.P. Hill in Virginia!
- Our outreach efforts, thanks to many donors including the United Way of East Central Iowa, increased its footprint in 2010. Over 750 youth participated in this community program.
- Council Scouts and leaders took part in a record popcorn sale, resulting in over 1.16 million dollars in sales!
- Allocated funding to enhance camp safety through purchases such as a new walk-in freezer as well as a new riding mower.
